

Apply for a Ballot by Mail

Applications must be received (not postmarked) at your county election office by the deadline.

Who can Vote-by-Mail?

Where to get an Application

- 65 years or older
- Sick or disabled
- Out of the county during early voting and on Election Day
- In jail, but otherwise eligible to vote.
- Expecting to give birth within three weeks before or after Election Day.
- Call to request an application from your County Election office
- Or go to <u>VoteTexas.gov</u> or your county website. Print, fill out, sign, and mail your application to the <u>Early Voting</u> <u>Clerk</u> in the county where you are registered to vote.

Fill Out the Application - Read All Instructions Provided

Sec. 1	 □ Provide your contact information so the county may contact you □ Provide your ID number □ A Texas Driver license □ A Texas Personal ID □ Election Identification Certificate □ and/or the last four digits of your Social Security number.
Sec. 2	☐ Provide the address where the ballot is to be mailed.

Sec. 4	 If you are 65 years or older, or are sick or disabled, mark the box for "Annual Application". If you are out of the county (where you are registered to vote) during early voting and on Election Day, mark which election you are applying to Vote by Mail. To vote in the Primary Election, mark your party.
Sec. 5	☐ Sign and date the application!
Sec. 6	Fill out if you assist a voter or witness a voter's signature Check the witness box if the voter is unable to sign the application or make a mark. (Do not sign the application for the voter.) Check the assistant box if you assist a voter or mail an application for a voter. Print and sign your name and provide your address.

Submit Your Ballot-by-Mail

#1. Fill out your Ballot-by-Mail ♥ Mark your Ballot-by-Mail using a black or blue pen. Fill in ovals completely; no checks, X's, or circles Place your ballot in the ballot envelope and seal it Put only one ballot in the envelope Place the ballot envelope in the carrier envelope
#2. Fill out your carrier envelope Write your contact information under the envelope flap Write your ID number under the envelope flap from: A Texas Driver license A Texas Personal ID Election Identification Certificate and/or the last four digits of your Social Security number. Seal the envelope and sign your name over the envelope flap.
If you assist a voter with their Ballot-by-Mail ☐ Read the oath ☐ Mark No for compensation ☐ Print and sign your name ☐ Write your relationship to the voter ☐ Write your address ☐ If you witness a voter's signature ☐ Check that the voter cannot make a mark ☐ Print the voter's name ☐ Print and sign your name ☐ Write your address ☐ Write your address
#3. Submit your Ballot-by-Mail as soon as possible Use one or two stamps to mail your ballot via US Postal Service, or use Fed Ex, UPS or DHL. Your ballot needs to arrive at your county election office by 7:00 pm on Election Day. Or hand deliver your Ballot-by-Mail in person to the county election office on Election Day while polls are open. You must show your photo ID. If you decide to vote in person instead Take your Ballot-by-Mail with you to your polling station during early voting or on Election Day and turn in to the voting clerk. You will be allowed to vote a regular ballot. If you lose or forget your Ballot-by-Mail, you may cast a provisional ballot.
