Voting by Mail in Texas



Use this checklist to make sure you complete every step of the vote by mail process.

Who can vote by mail?

You can vote by mail if you are:

- 65 years or older
- Sick or disabled
- Out of the county during early voting and on **Election Day**
- Expecting to give birth within 3 weeks before or after Election Day
- In jail, but otherwise eligible to vote.

Your application must be **received** 11 days or more before Election Day. You can:




How to mark and return your ballot

Expect your ballot to arrive about 45 days before Election Day.

1. Mark and pack your ballot



Mark your ballot with a black or blue pen. Fill in the ovals completely.



No checks, X's, or circles.

- Put your ballot in the ballot envelope and seal it. Put only 1 ballot in the ballot envelope.
- Place the ballot envelope in the carrier envelope. Don't seal it yet!

2. 3. Return your ballot as soon as you can

Your ballot must be **received** by 7:00 pm on Election Day. You can do 1 of the following:

- Mail your ballot by US Postal Service. If you aren't sure how many stamps to put, use 2 stamps to be safe. You can also use FedEx, UPS, or DHL to return your ballot.
- Hand deliver your ballot in person. You can only hand deliver your ballot to your main County Election Office on Election Day while polls are open. You must show photo ID.
- - Take your mail ballot to your polling place during early voting or on Election Day and you can vote a regular ballot.
 - If you lose or forget your mail ballot, you can use a provisional ballot.
